**Changing Inauguration Day.**  
The joint resolution which passed the senate making presidential inauguration day May 4 instead of March 4 will meet with much favor throughout the country. It passed the senate by more than the necessary majority. It will be two years at least, however, before the amendment to the United States constitution becomes part of the supreme law of the land. After being put through congress and receiving the president's signature, it must be ratified by the necessary majority of all the states. Many of these have only occasional legislatures, and next winter will be the off year with a number of them.

**The Sultan's Turkish Ambassador.**  
His excellency Mirza Mahmud Khan, the sultan's ambassador at Constantinople, holds his distinguished office upon conditions which are quite without precedent in the diplomatic world. The Lord of the Lion and the Sun does not devote a penny of his revenue to maintaining a representative at Stamboul. He has in that city about 15,000 subjects, and these are duly taxed for the purpose. Mirza Mahmud has no reason to complain of the arrangement, for by the help of half a dozen alcoholized collectors he secures an income of about 200,000. True, he is compelled to hand over 24,000 yearly to his colleague at Vienna, but the balance enables him to live very comfortably. The contributors, however, insist upon his spending a certain amount on hospitality, and whenever he gives a dinner party to the corps diplomatique a committee of taxpayers is posted in an anteroom, whence they can satisfy themselves that their ambassador does the thing in proper style and keeps up the dignity of the nation.—London Chronicle.

WASHINGTON LETTER.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 28, 1898.  
There is more expectation than war news in Washington, so far as the public is concerned. That is why the hourly rumor finds believers no matter how wild it may be.

The national senate, by a vote of 89 to 10, has adopted a resolution making the first Thursday in May inauguration day hereafter.

The prohibition state convention of New Hampshire, to nominate a candidate for governor, and to attend to any other necessary business, will be held in G. A. R. hall, off Pleasant street, Concord, on Wednesday, June 1, 1898, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Memorial Day will be observed in Antrim as follows: Ephraim Weston Post, No. 87, G. A. R., will leave Jameson hall in carriages at 7.45 a. m., arriving at North Branch chapel at 8.45 a. m., where the column will be formed under the direction of Squires Forsyth, Marshal of the Day, in the following order:
