### Watch Night Service.

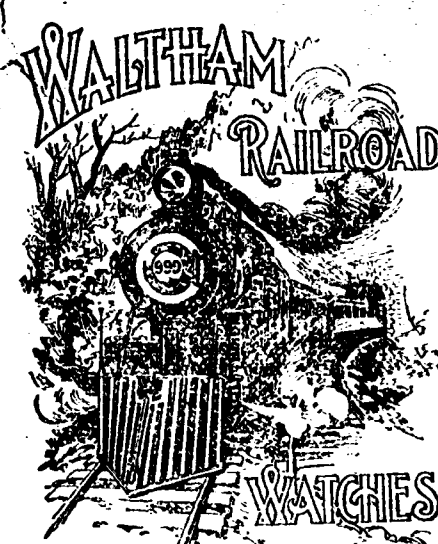
